Welcome from the AIS President

It is always the president's privilege to welcome the participants to our annual meeting. I feel particularly privileged to be welcoming you all to this gathering, the 38th annual meeting of the association, and the first one in which we will convene face-to-face after two difficult years. Our conference in 2020 had to be cancelled due to the Corona pandemic, and our 37th meeting was held virtually last year. As I write this, there are some indications of another wave possibly developing, but we remain optimistic that we will in fact be gathering in person to undertake our business of learning from one another and making connections between scholars of Israel from around the world.

This is a challenging time beyond the Covid pandemic as well. We will be meeting, it appears, as Russia's war against Ukraine continues and threatens to expand. It seems to have already ushered in a new global era that is sure to have an impact on the ways in which we will study Israel, on international collaborations and on other aspects of our ongoing activity, many of which are difficult to foresee at this point. Numerous scholars from Ukraine and from Russia have now become refugees, and many of our colleagues have been involved in hosting them at institutions in many countries. As these global changes take place before our eyes and shape a new world order, our own corner of academic activity, the field of Israel Studies, is in a period of institutional and methodological flux, even as the nature of academic work-certainly in the humanities and social sciences—is itself facing a range of challenges and trials.

Within these contexts, AIS has been working to bolster our collaborations and to enhance the field of Israel Studies internationally. We have growing networks of scholars in China, India, Brazil, and

have been in the process of solidifying our relationship and collaborative basis with our sister organization, the European Association for Israel Studies. Academic work, as we all know (and would do well to remind ourselves daily), takes place in conversation and dialogue, and the more we can expand our frameworks of discourse and analysis, the deeper we can hope to probe, and the richer our understandings and analyses. This, of course, is the principal goal of the enhanced networking and collaboration that we have been undertaking, and it is represented inter alia in the rich and diverse program that our hosts at Bar Ilan, together with the program committee, have put together.

It is with this in mind that we will convene at our General Assembly this year with the need to reach a crucial decision: The Middle East Studies Association (MESA) recently adopted a pro-BDS resolution, and we will consequently have to make a decision as to our continued relationship with them. The formal reason for bringing this to the General Assembly is that our affiliation with MESA is written in our bylaws, and any change in the bylaws requires a vote of the members who attend our GA. The importance of the discussion at the General Assembly, however, goes beyond this (important) formality and touches on matters of principal and the very identity of the AIS. The AIS Board met in a special session this spring to discuss the matter, and passed by majority vote a resolution that determined that the Association will end its affiliation with MESA until such time as MESA should retract its pro-BDS resolution. It is important to stress the two main motivations for this resolution: First, as a matter of principle, AIS is an academic association and does not affiliate with

ideological, political or advocacy groups. Secondly, the MESA resolution has a direct bearing on all AIS members whose affiliations are with Israeli academic institutions. At the date of this writing, these constitute some 60% of our membership. It is the view of the majority of the AIS Board that given these two factors, AIS cannot continue to be an affiliated society of MESA. We now bring this decision to the full membership of our association for ratification at the General Assembly.

AIS is determined to continue to stand for academic freedom and integrity and for the ability of scholars to convene and to pursue knowledge and that modicum of truth which we strive to glimpse and to unveil in our work—to freely study Israeli society, culture, politics, and history.

It is my pleasure, then, to welcome you all to this 38th annual meeting of the Association for Israel Studies. As I noted above, we are very pleased at the rich and varied program, and we are excited to be able to learn from it in a face-to-face format. I am extremely grateful to Anina Selve, Stephanie Colley and Asaf Shamis-our outstanding AIS administrative staff-for their dedicated and tireless work in bringing this together. I am pleased to take this opportunity to welcome our newest staff member, Romy Ronen, who joins as our new social media manager. I thank the Bar-Ilan team, led by Lilach Rosenberg-Friedman, Hizky Shoham and Izik Pass, for hosting us this year, for putting together this excellent program, and for the productive and pleasant collaboration that went into its preparation. Thanks are due to the program committee and its vital work on the program. I have had exceptionally good fortune to be working with an AIS Executive that is a constant source of wisdom and support-Vice President

Rafi Cohen-Almagor, Treasurer Ilan Ben-Ami and Executive Director Asaf Shamis.

I look forward to having us all gather at the green and pleasant Bar-Ilan campus, and to having a chance to catch up with colleagues we haven't seen in a while and, I hope, to make new acquaintances.



In Memoriam

Dr. Tally Kritzman-Amir [Z"L] (1979-2022)

AIS Board member since 2019

On Saturday, May 21, 2022, our colleague, Dr. Tally Kritzman-Amir passed away. A member of the Association for Israel Studies board and of the conference's organizing committee, a scholar committed to the study of law and society in Israel, and an activist on behalf of refugees and asylumseekers-Tally will be deeply missed by the Israel Studies community worldwide.

Tally received her LL. B (cum lauda, 2002) and Ph.D. (2009) from the Tel Aviv University School of Law, and then clerked for Justice Mishael Cheshin in the Israeli Supreme Court. She held positions at the Ramat Gan College of Law and Business, where she founded the clinic for refugee rights, as well as Boston University, Harvard, Yale, NYU, and the Van-Leer institute in Jerusalem. Tally's work focused particularly on refugees and asylum law in Israel. Her pioneering and penetrating scholarship is among the most important contributions to the study of this formative aspect of Israeli law and society. At the same time, Tally promoted the rights and well-being of the refugee and asylumseeker community in Israel. According to Anat Ben-Dor from the Refugee Rights Clinic at Tel Aviv University, "Her impact on her field is long-lasting. She founded a legal clinic, published prolifically, cultivated students, and formed partnerships. The book she edited (Where Levinski Meets Asmara: Asylum Seekers and Refugees in Israel - Social and Legal Aspects) and the articles and book chapters she wrote document, analyze, and criticize the reception of refugees and migrants by the State of Israel. Her work is an essential part of any syllabus on immigration to Israel and is often cited by Israeli courts and scholars."

Tally is the 2022 recipient of the AIS Early Career Award, in recognition of her important contribution to scholarship on Israel. The selection committee voted unanimously to grant Tally the award given the "sheer breadth and depth of her achievements, unparalleled by many distinguished researchers".

Here are a few more words about her from colleagues and friends:

"A former student, among the brightest I have ever had, who then became my colleague and coauthor, for me Tally has been above all a beloved friend and a most reliable source of knowledge to whom I could always turn when searching for advice and clarity regarding the ever changing and often obscure socio-legal world of migration." "Her work, conducted in conjunction with a coalition of advocates in Israel, was both theoretically fascinating and of huge practical importance to the lives of many disempowered and marginalized women. Tally was a passionate advocate for the disadvantaged, always seeking to use her skills as a scholar and relationship-builder to take action on their behalf. A typical email from her pointed to the rise in domestic violence or homicide against women in Israel and suggested how we could work together to highlight these issues and support research on them. I will miss her voice and hope to carry forward her vision for a more compassionate and equal world." (Lisa Fishbayn Joffe, Brandeis University)





The Department of Israel Studies at the University of Haifa offers a multidisciplinary approach on the studies of the different nations and peoples who acted, lived and still live in the space of Palestine/Eretz-Israel, and in the State of Israel. Accordingly, the program comprises a variety of disciplines, such as: History, Geography, Sociology, Anthropology, and Cultural Studies of the country. The Area Studies approach strives to develop in our students the ability and competence to understand the land of Israel, its physical components, and its historical uniqueness. It also prepares our students to teach, guide tourists and pupils, and to research present and past events, processes and changes which have shaped landscapes of the country. 




