

Rothschild Prize 2024 CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

Excellence Award for Israeli PhD students in Theoretical Computer Science

In honour of the 2024 Rothschild Prize in Computer Sciences awarded to Prof. Moni Naor (Weizmann Institute of Science), Yad Hanadiv invites applications for an Excellence Award in theoretical computer science from PhD students from all Israeli universities.

The award committee will choose up to three award recipients, who will receive an award of NIS 5,000 each. Award recipients will also be invited to give a short presentation at a symposium honouring Prof. Moni Naor.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

To apply, <u>please fill out the application form</u> by **8 August 2024.** Each candidate must be a PhD student whose research is in theoretical computer science, in good standing with the university, and have an anticipated graduation date no earlier than 19 September 2024.

Note that there is no limit on the number of applications from any one department.

APPLICATION DOCUMENTS:

- A one-page application letter with a summary of achievements during the PhD, including references.
- A curriculum vitae including a list of publications (if any).
- Letters of recommendation: the application should include a letter of recommendation from the applicants Ph.D. advisor, and up to two additional letters of recommendation. All letters should be sent directly by the recommender to rpreg@yadhanadiv.org.il by the application deadline.

All documents must be submitted in English and combined in PDF form.
